


Dance performance for open space

A fable based on sub-particle physics and an allegory of our time

I he discovery of the omegaminus particle, appearing briefly near the bottom of the bubble-chamber photograph. This is one of the most celebrated pictures in the history of physics, because it confirmed that the patterns of particles being offered by Murray Gell-Mann and others had real meaning. It was predicted as a heavy particle that would survive long enough to leave a track in a bubble chamber, and would have three doses of 'strangeness'. In February 1964, Nicholas Samios and his colleagues at the Brookhaven National Laboratory found this picture among their bubble-chamber results.





The photograph shows the omega-minus leaving a short track, breaking up in three stages (shedding one dose of strangeness on each occasion) and finishing up as a proton.

"Me, as I am, I do not establish the rules, but I play my part, March to the tune and dance the dance, following the laws that govern the order of the day,



The Partners in the Dance

Sense: Sensuality



Imagination: Science and industry (cybernetic)



Fantasy: Imagination united with judgement (the Dodo)



Estimation: time, space and the spectrum of measurement. (Proportionality)



Memory: the wit of recalling past events; our innocence of youthfulness and desire for harmony. (Adam and Eve)
